## **Mud: Explore and Learn**

June 29th is International Mud Day; but you can play and learn with mud all year long! Is there anything better than watching kids play together in the mud? Celebrate children's organic play and share your favorite mud moments and memories on Face Book with us! @GRECSMobile

## Here are 3 fun ways to celebrate:

**Mud play:** Offer shovels, buckets, plastic animals and figures and water. Ask: what would happen if you did a deep hole and fill it with water? A shallow hole? Let your child explore and see what they discover. (See Five Essentials to Meaningful Play)

**Mud paint:** Fill a cup with dirt and water and mix to create mud paint. Use sticks or paintbrushes to paint on paper or the sidewalk. Construct mud objects: Shape mud pies or sculptures. Children can decorate with pebbles, or other found objects if they like. Ask: what would happen if you add more water? More dirt? Leave it to dry in the sun?

**Mud books:** Read books about mud! Try: *Pigs in the Mud in the Middle of the Rud* by: Lynn Plourde; *Mud Pies and Other Recipes* by: Marjorie Winslow; *Stuck in the Mud* by Shana Corey; *Harry the Dirty Dog* by: Gene Zion

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## **Alabama Early Learning Guidelines (AELG)**

Children grow, develop, and learn throughout their lives. Alabama's Early Learning Guidelines are presented as a guide of building blocks that are important to support early care and to educate providers in preparing each child for future success in school and life. This basic- level, 18-hour course is broken down into 9, two-hour sessions. After completing the 18-hour curse, you will receive an Alabama Early Learning Guidelines Credential from The Department of Human Resources.

**Intermediate** = Most appropriate for professionals who have at least (2) years of experience and 120 hours of training in child development, and are moving toward more formal education. Intermediate Level Training includes expanding knowledge and application, and refining skills.

**Advanced** = Most appropriate for professionals who have at least three (3) years of experience and 30 credit hours in child development. Advanced Level Training focuses on a more thorough knowledge and understanding of developmentally appropriate practice and highly effective application and demonstration of skills.


## **April Activities**

### **Nature & Outdoor Learning:**

# A Family Shadow Walk

Family walks, no matter where (around the block, in a park, at the beach), provide wonderful opportunities to explore the mysteries of light and shadows. Your child can learn a lot—like how to make shadows bigger and smaller and how shadows move. Enjoy the walk and the fun of observing shadows and how they change as you move about outdoors.

Along to

Parents

- Notice the shadows of the things around you—cars, a dog or cat, a bird flying from tree to tree.
- Observe the way your shadows "walk" along with you, and play with the shadows!
- Make different types of shadows by moving your arms or legs or jumping about.
- Use chalk to outline your shadow and your child's shadow. Come back later in the day to check on your shadows. In what ways are they the same or different?
- Measure the lengths of your shadows using pieces of yarn or string or with a tape measure. Measure the shadows of other objects too, like a parked car, trees, the mailbox, or anything else that casts a shadow.

## Ask questions or make comments that help your child think:

- I wonder what will happen to your shadow if you step forward or back?
- What might happen if we stand close together?
- Where is the sun in the sky right now? (Ask this at several times of the day.)
- What happens to shadows on a cloudy day?
- Explore, observe, and enjoy doing and learning about science together!
