Rocking & Kolling Why Outdoor Play Is Essential for Healthy Development: Fresh Air, Fun,

It can be challenging to take young children outside - from naps to mealtimes and sunscreen to mittens, a trip outdoors might feel like too much hassle. Additionally, play outside may seem unruly, overwhelming, or lacking in learning opportunities. But outdoor play is worth the time and effort.

What Are the Benefits of Outdoor Play? 1. It invites children to learn science

Children are natural explorers and discoverers, and you can bring whatever interests them back to your early childhood setting for further exploration. By turning their questions into group inquiry projects, you'll soon have several starting points for emergent curriculum.

2. It creates opportunities for social interaction & collaboration

Outdoor play provides a chance to practice social and emotional skills with other children, including problem solving, turn taking, encouragement, selfcontrol, safe risk taking, and following the rules of a game. It also provides opportunities to develop empathy.

3. It promotes physical health

The obesity rate for US children ages 2 to 5 is 14%, and it rises to over 40% for middle-aged adults, leading to an increased risk of health problems like diabetes and heart diseases. That's one reason why the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends a "prescription for play" at every well-child visit through age 2 & Nemours Health and Prevention Services recommends daily, supervised outdoor time for children from birth to age 5, Specifically,

Children learn as they play. More importantly, in play children learn how to learn. - 0. Fred Donaldson

Early Childhood Services

Nemours calls for toddlers to have at least 30 minutes of structured (adult-led) physical activity and at least 60 minutes of unstructured (child-led) physical activity each day. Outdoor play is a great way to model the joy of physical activity. When children run, jump, climb, throw and kick balls, and ride toys that require balance, they also build gross motor skills and start developing a habit of being active.

4. It promotes better sleep

A study of 2- to 5-year-olds showed that children who play outdoors sleep better at night. This may be due to the physical activity, stress reduction, and exposure to natural light that come with playing outdoors. You may want to share this information with families—a tired, happy child is one who sleeps well!



Children don't understand what is happening in this crazy Covid-19 world nor why their once safe, predictable life is suddenly upturned.

Consequently, children will naturally react to this uncertainty and abrupt change in their lives and routines. It is no surprise that the Covid-19 pandemic is causing trauma for some children, if not all children, in one way or another. Children simply do not understand why they feel the way they do.

At home, or at school, traumatized children may show the following symptoms:

- Acting out Attention getting behaviors such as tantrums, destroying things, showing off, refusing to eat prepared meals.
- Aggression Grabbing toys from others, fighting more with siblings, or being mean to the family pet or younger siblings.
- Regression Bed wetting, using baby talk, refusing to sleep alone.
- Clinginess Not wanting to be alone, wanting to be held more frequently, insisting only mommy can give ideas or soothe problems.

Withdrawal - Abnormally quiet and/or wanting to be by him/herself, not wanting to play or eat, sleeping more.

What can we do to help children who may be traumatized by Covid-19 happenings? Make time for unstructured play! Whether at home and/or in the classroom, indoors and outdoors—nothing is more important than allowing the child to freely choose what to play. Provide a wide variety of props and toys, small and large. Set up a hospital in a corner of the classroom or bedroom. Add

"Mothing is more important than "Nothing is nore" "Nothing is more by providing lots of materials like cardboard boxes, tape, markers, sewing materials, etc. Allow the child to take the lead in play themes because the child knows what is troubling them and will show you through his/her play. As the adult, listen, observe, and actively role-play with the child whatever the child directs you to be.

allowing the child Children need plenty of time for unstructured, child-directed play, daily. Allow a minimum of 60 minutes inside and the same outside—longer if play is progressing well and the child is still interested to freely chose in playing and extending the theme—especially during these traumatizing times. Don't skimp on what to play, outdoor play. It is extremely important for many reasons; including that children learn and experience things what to play, outdoors that they can't possibly learn indoors.

We will all get through these troubling times. Play is the means to healing - both for your child and for you!



Training Levels

Basic = Most appropriate for entry-level professionals who are new to early childhood and/or school-age care. Basic Level Training covers a foundational understanding and demonstration of developing skills.

Intermediate = Most appropriate for professionals who have at least (2) years of experience and 120 hours of training in child development, and are moving toward more formal education. Intermediate Level Training includes expanding knowledge and application, and refining skills.

Advanced = Most appropriate for professionals who have at least three (3) years of experience and 30 credit hours in child development. Advanced Level Training focuses on a more thorough knowledge and understanding of developmentally appropriate practice and highly effective application and demonstration of skills.
