Children grow, develop, and learn throughout their lives. Alabama's Early Learning Guidelines are presented as a guide of building blocks that are important to support early care and to educate providers in preparing each child for future success in school and life. This basic-level, 18-hour course is broken down into 9, two-hour sessions. After completing the 18-hour course, you will receive an Alabama Early Learning Guidelines Credential from The Department of Human Resources.

## 9 Steps to Positive Parenting

#### See your child's point of view during tough moments

We all want to keep our cool! Sometimes it helps to remember that your child's perspective is very different from yours.

#### Celebrate your child's strengths and capacity to learn

Each child is unique, growing and learning at his own pace. Make a conscious effort to really see your child.





#### Delight in moments of connection

It's easy to get distracted by the day-to-day grind of parenting: dishes, laundry, naps, and transitions from one activity to the next. Offer big smiles when they want to show you something.

#### Respond with interest and sensitivity

Every child communicates their needs differently. Taking the time to watch and learn your child's cues teaches them that they are important and cherished.





#### Provide age-based guidelines, limits, and boundaries.

Parenting is a combination of nurture and structure. All children need guidance on how to behave. Maintaining predictable routines and setting kind, firm limits really help.

#### Recognize your own feelings before responding

This sounds like common sense, but it is way harder to pull off than many of us thought. Understanding ourselves is a great way to help our children.





#### Parenting can be stressful and mistakes happen

We can't be calm, cool, and collected all the time. Setting things right is part of building a relationship, and helps children learn how to do this as they grow older.


#### Balance your needs and your child's needs

It's so easy to get wrapped up in the demands of parenting that you can forget to take care of yourself. Plan for breaks throughout the day..





Seek help and support on parenting when you need it Every parent eventually runs into a challenging child-rearing issue. Don't shy away from asking for help from friends, family, or professionals. All parents need—and deserve—support.




