Awesome Fall Activities For Babies And Toddlers That Put Everything In Their Mouth

There are so many fun things to do with your kids in the fall, let's gather a few activities to get you started. These fall activities for baby are safe for babies and one-year-olds who still tend to put everything into their mouths but can also be enjoyed by the older ones too!

Create a Fall Discovery Basket

Fall activities for babies can include a ton of sensory bags. These are fun to look at, fun to squeeze, and super fun and easy to make.



Use real or fake pumpkins to create a fall discovery basket. Collect a few pumpkins and place them in a basket. Let your little one explore the smell, texture and size of each one.

Fall Sensory Bags



Sensory Bags are great for babies practicing tummy time.

If you have an older baby/toddler that tends to grab these bags and put them in their mouth you can tape the bag to the floor to avoid them picking it up and instead, focus on exploring the items inside by squish-

ing and moving them around. For babies that are sitting already or even standing up,

taping these sensory bags to a window it will encourage them to stand and sit while working on cross body movement. A movement of the arm going from side to side, passing their mid-line of the body; an early activity that will later translate into writing.



Discovering Fall Items Safely

A great way to share fall and all of our favorite things about it is through a safe sensory bag. Add acorns, seeds, pine cones and any other fall related items to discover without having to worry about if they are putting it in their mouth.



Collect dry leaves, colorful leaves, big and small and add them to a bag. Place them on the floor and secure the bag with tape. Allow your child to explore. Babies can do tummy time, toddlers can explore stepping on them. Talk about what they feel, what they see and where they come from.

Take them on the nature walk to collect the leaves too! two activities in one!



Alabama Early Learning Guidelines (AELG)

The Alabama Early Learning Guidelines were developed to promote continuity of high-quality care and learning for children ages 0-5. The AELG course serves as a guide for understanding child development and for implementing best practices to prepare children for success in school and in life. Participants who complete this course will receive 18 training hours and the official AELG Credential issued by the Alabama Department of Human Resources. This course may only be completed once. If you have received this credential through AELG face-to-face training or the online version, you will not receive credit again. GOING BEYOND THE PLAYGROUND

Math, Science and Outdoor Fun

Autumn is the perfect time for going outside for a walk or to a local park to play are great ways to help your children learn! In addition to spending time at the playground, take your time to explore: do you see trees to count, neighbors to greet, or street signs to read?

Here are some ideas for playful learning that will help make the most of your family's time outdoors.

Street sign scavenger hunt

While walking through the nerighborhood, invite your child to look at and identify signs, like STOP and No Parking. Talk about them. This helps children understand that written words and symbols have many important purposes: to keep us safe, to help us work together, and to spread essential information. Try prompting your child's thinking with questions like, "What signs do you see? I wonder what clues help us figure out what the signs says." Work together to identify the colors, letters, and numbers on different signs!

Science on the hill

Hills are such fun for rolling, running, and exploring. Did you know that hills are also great for learning science concepts and vocabulary? Try this in the park with your child: collect different nature items (pinecones, pebbles, sticks) and test whether they roll down a hill. Use words like faster, slower, speed, weight, mass, and slope as you experiement. Children also love to roll their bodies down hills!

Help your child be a noticer

Practice noticing numbers, letters, and other details as you explore outdoors. Encourage your child by saying and doing things like these:

- "I see numbers on this sign! I see the number three. I wonder what it means" and "What other numbers can we find on our walk, and what do they tell us?"
- "I see some footprints going across the ground. I wonder who made them. Where are they going?" Create a story together about the footprints.
- "I spy with my little eye... a cloud shaped like the letter O! What do you see?"

Identify the parks and other outdoor spaces in your neighborhood

Sometimes the most magical places are just around the corner. Websites like findyourpark.com/your-parks can help you identify nearby parks. Even the tiniest spaces can hold magic for you and your family!
