Outdoor Winter Activities

Enjoying the outdoors is not limited to the summer months. Winter offers a host of thrilling activities and adventures for children. Wearing appropriate clothing is key to being able to enjoy the winter weather so make sure the kids are bundled up to keep warm and dry.

Here are a few activities to get children inspired and moving when the world is cold and white:

Observe Birds

Once you start bird watching, you'll be amazed how much can be learned by observation. Put up a bird feeder outside your classroom window. A tree near the bird feeder gives the birds a safe place to hide, and you'll find they stick around. Brave little chickadees can be lured to



your hand with some sunflower seeds. Borrow a few bird books from the library and keep a list of all the birds you see. You could even make some binoculars to extend the project into your art or dramatic area.

Tracking



Teaching environmental responsibility and a love for the natural world starts very young. Identifying and following animal tracks in fresh snow is a great way to teach children the skills of scientific observation as well as providing a positive incentive to get outside when the snow might not be

deep enough for other activities. Without needing any materials, following tracks can be as exciting as a game of hide-and-seek or playing detective! Which animals are active in your location during the winter months? You may be surprised at what you discover.

Play Tag

One of my favorite childhood memories is playing tag in the new-fallen snow. We'd tramp down paths, then play tag using only the pathways we'd made. Or we'd make a large hole in the snow, and toss snowballs in for a game of snow basketball.



Nature Walks

The natural world of winter is amazing when observed with all the senses. Talk with the children about what they might see, hear, feel, smell, or taste in winter. Then, on your nature walk, ask them to point out interesting nature objects or phenomena. When you get back

inside make a list of the things you noticed. Make pictures or find out more from books.

- Sights: Shapes of snow drifts, colors in the snow (you'd be amazed!)
- Sounds: Sound of the whistling wind, the quiet of the snow falling, roar of a leaf blower
- Feel: The downy touch of snowflakes, soft (or spiky) pine needles or the rough bark of a tree
- Smell: Fresh-cut pine, wood smoke, cocoa!

Babies and toddlers thrive when their world feels loving, safe, and predictable. Respond with smiles, words, and touch to help them see, hear, and feel your love. You will help them develop a sense of security and self-control.

Talk, Sing, and Point

Babies learn language from the moment they are born. Respond to their sounds, and later, their words. Connect with eye contact and a loving tone of voice, while pointing to help the know what you are talking about.

Count, Group, and Compare

Every child's brain is wired for math. Talk about numbers, shapes, patterns, and comparisons as you go about your routines together. Watch your child learn to love math.

Explore Through Movement and Play

Babies are like scientists who love making discoveries. Watch to see what interests your child, then encourage their curiosity and help them learn when they play and explore.

Read and Discuss Stories

Reading turns kids into confident thinkers. Make books a regular part of your relationship from the very beginning. With infants, point at the pictures and speak with excitement. With toddlers, just make it fun.

Who Is Involved?

Lots of people! Partners include hospitals, health centers, schools, community centers, childcare providers, churches, family members, and others.

What If I'm Not a Parent?

You still care about children! Learn about The Basics principles. Encourage parents and caregivers to make sure their children experience all five with everyone who cares for them.

The Alabama Early Learning Guidelines were developed to promote continuity of high-quality care and learning for children ages 0-5. The AELG course serves as a guide for understanding child development and for implementing best practices to prepare children for success in school and in life. Participants who complete this course will receive 18 training hours and the official AELG Credential issued by the Alabama Department of Human Resources. This course may only be completed once. If you have received this credential through AELG face-to-face training or the online version, you will not receive credit again. 

Cooking in the Classroom By Regina Abraham






T hink about some of your earliest childhood memories. Chances are, many of those memories involve food. For me, some of my earliest memories include the smell of fresh cherry pie baking in my grandmother's kitchen and having my grandmother tell me to go out to the garden and "pick a salad" for dinner. Food brings people together and provides opportunities for shared experiences. Recipes are handed down from generation to generation and so many family and holiday traditions include special foods. Young children pretend to cook all the time. They "bake" mud pies using sand, dirt, and

water and run a kitchen using play food, dishes, and utensils in the dramatic play area. "Play cooking" is a logical precursor to actual cooking. Young children like to imitate what the adults around them are doing. Cooking gives children real life opportunities to help plan, create, and serve the food that they are consuming. Cooking is a universal necessity and an important life skill. Children who learn healthy eating and cooking habits at a young age are more likely to grow up to be adults with healthy eating and cooking habits. When introducing young children to cooking, it's best to start small. Use recipes that require few ingredients and simple steps. As children become more proficient, and adults become more comfortable with the process, add more complex recipes to your repertoire. Always try your recipes prior to sharing them with children. You want the children to experience the joy of discovery at the outcome. However, as a teacher, you don't want any surprises.

Books and Activities to Introduce Children to Cooking!

I here are many great books that can be paired with cooking activities. The Doorbell Rang by Pat Hutchins is a great opportunity to teach about sharing, fractions, and making cookies. If you Give a Moose a Muffin by Laura Numeroff lends itself beautifully to a muffin making activity. Little Red Hen Makes a Pizza by Phillemon Sturgess is a great twist on a classic tale which allows the opportunity not only for a literature study to compare and contrast different versions of similar stories—but also an opportunity to make pizza.



F ractions, measuring, sequencing, and counting are a few of the many math concepts that can be incorporated into cooking activities. A child can cut the stick of butter in half, or cut the banana into thirds. When measuring dry ingredients, you can use a half cup measure twice to make a full cup, or a quarter cup measure four times to make a cup. If you make a round pizza, would you rather share it evenly with four people (quarters) or three people (thirds)? Which scenario would give you more (or less) pizza?
