Infant / Toddler Institute WITH Dr. Rosemarie Allen

Rosemarie Allen has served as a leader in early childhood education for nearly 40 years. Her life's work is centered on ensuring children have access to high-quality early childhood programs that are developmentally and culturally appropriate. She is currently an Associate Professor in the School of Education at the Metropolitan State University of Denver. Her classes are focused on ensuring teachers are aware of how issues of equity, privilege, and power impact teaching practices. She is also the President & CEO of the Institute for Racial Equity & Excellence. In 2012, Dr. Allen was appointed a Global Leader for Young Children by the World Forum on Early Care and Education. She collaborates with professionals and advocates from more than 80 countries who meet to share inspiration and information on issues impacting children and families worldwide. Rosemarie earned her B. A. from California State University, M.Ed from Lesley University, and EdD in Equity and Leadership in Education at the University of Colorado, Denver.

Session 1: Preventing Early Childhood Suspensions, It's All About You!

This workshop will provide information regarding the relationship between children's behavior and the adult's responses to undesired behavior. The role of implicit bias on behavioral expectations will be discussed, and strategies provided for aligning practitioner expectations with those of children and families.

Session 2: The Role of Implicit Bias in Explaining Disparities in Early Childhood Expulsions and Suspensions.

This session will provide information on the impact of implicit bias on the disproportionate number of children of color who are suspended and expelled from early childhood programs. The workshop will focus on solutions, interventions, resources, approaches, and strategies to address implicit bias, especially as it pertains to exclusionary discipline.

I am involved with Alabama's Early Intervention System at the local and state levels. I consult with families of children with disabilities, other professionals serving children with disabilities and their families, as well as the public schools. I provide professional development to early interventionists and child care professionals. I am also a Board Member for Gulf Regional Early Childhood Services an agency that provides Early Head Start services in southwest Alabama. My philosophy of education is simple. I want my students to be passionate about teaching ALL students, including those with disabilities. I want them to understand that ALL

children can learn and that we have not done our jobs as teachers if our students do not learn. Learning should be a fun process for all involved. In addition, I want my students to appreciate the role that research plays in their work as a teacher and as a professional. They should research and evaluate the effectiveness of their work with their students. They should turn to the professional research literature to find the strategies that will best work with each student. Finally, I want my students to be advocates for the students they teach as well as for their families.

Full Diversity: Meeting the Needs of Young Children with Developmental Delays



• oung children—birth to age 8—with developmental delays are a critical part of an early childhood program's diversity. They deserve to be fully included within the culture, activities, and mission of the program.

While meeting the unique needs of young children with developmental delays is complex and fraught with challenges, these are some general ideas to address the needs of this vulnerable population:

- Make sure your curriculum is truly developmentally appropriate, with lots of play, art, music, and dance.
- Make sure academic and behavioral expectations—especially around restricting movement and direct instruction—are truly developmental.
- Make sure all activities can be adjusted—both easier and more difficult.
- Before recommending a child be assessed for a delay or disability, examine all other possible reasons for the child's difficulties (i.e. inappropriate expectations, the classroom environment, non-English speaking children, their home situation, and so on). Studies show that screening recommendations can become self-fulfilling prophecies.
- Give all students—including those with developmental delays—many opportunities to succeed throughout the day.
- If a child has been assigned a disability label—i.e. ADHD or autism spectrum disorder—do not use it around children, parents, or other teachers (except those who need this information), and never assign a child a label without due process (assessments and parent permission). Do not allow children to use a label to describe a child with a delay.





- Never use what a child likes to do or is good at doing as a reward for achieving skills or tasks. Affirmations should not have to be earned. Further, never take away what a child can do and is good at doing as a punishment.
- Make sure a child's treatment or therapy does not interfere with activities the child likes and enjoys, such as playing with other children or outdoor activities. Effective therapy is embedded within pleasurable and ongoing classroom activities.

Finally, as with all forms of diversity, early childhood programs and schools need to make sure that there are books and other curricular materials in the classroom that show and discuss a diversity of people with disabilities, and that show these people leading successful and productive lives.

Benefits for Child Care Centers, Family and Group Home Providers

Availability

Alabama's new Special Needs Childcare Subsidy is available statewide.

Reimbursement

Participating centers will be reimbursed \$250 per week. There is no penalty when a child is not in attendance, so the center will be reimbersed regardless of attendance.

Inclusion Support

Childcare staff will have FREE access to training, consultation, technical assistance, and adaptive materials provided by Childcare Enhancement with a Purpose (CCEP) Inclusion Consultants statewide to support inclusion in the classroom.



About the Subsidy

Financial assistance is now available for qualifying Alabama families of a child with special needs to attend quality, inclusive childcare programs statewide. To qualify, the child must be receiving services (IFSP, IEP, private therapy, etc.).
