Healthy Habits for the New Year!

Healthy habits are important life skills. They include selecting nutritious foods, practicing good hygiene, engaging in regular physical activity, focusing on positive feelings, and getting plenty of sleep. As an educator, you can help young children start developing these healthy habits in fun and engaging ways!

Nutritious Foods

It's never too early to have conversations about good nutrition. Engage in discussions about the benefits of different foods to help children become more conscious of their diets and make informed decisions about what they choose to eat.

Story Time or Songs: Read books or sing songs about healthy eating. There are many children's books and songs that talk about fruits, vegetables, and the importance of a balanced diet. This helps reinforce the idea of healthy eating in a fun and interactive way.



Good Hygiene

Hygiene helps us keep our bodies clean and healthy, which positively impacts our social and emotional health. The following activity gives children the opportunity to practice effective hygiene routines through a fun, active game.

Handwashing Relay: Create a relay race where kids have to run to a "washing station," properly wash their hands (with supervision and guidance), and then tag the next teammate. This game makes handwashing fun and emphasizes the importance of doing it thoroughly.

Positive Feelings

As a teacher, you know that one of your main goals is to help children become aware of their emotions and to be mindful of how to appropriately express them. Creating a feelings flip-book gives children an opportunity to identify and reflect on scenarios that spark their emotions.



Feelings flip-book: Give each child a piece of paper (or, if more appropriate for your specific age group, prepare the flip-books in advance so the children can begin at the drawing step). Fold the paper lengthwise. On the top half of the paper, cut three slits, creating four flaps. Write a feeling (happy, sad, frustrated) on each flap. Underneath each flap, draw a picture that expresses that feeling.

Healthy habits are essential from childhood through adulthood, and as educators, we have many opportunities to inspire children to make informed choices. Instilling healthy habits at an early age sets up young children for leading active and balanced lives.

Valuing Diversity: Developing a Deeper Understanding of All Young Children's Behavior

Everything we think, say, and do is processed through our own cultural backgrounds. But because culture is absorbed and passed down from generation to generation rather than explicitly taught, we're seldom aware of it.

Culture shapes not only our values and beliefs, but also our gender roles, family structures, languages, dress, food, etiquette, approaches to disabilities, child-rearing practices, and even our expectations for children's behavior. In this way, culture creates diversity.



The Difference Between Equitable and Equal

Equal is not the same as equitable. Every child in your group has different needs, skills, interests, and abilities. Equal would mean giving all children the same activities, materials, and books. Equitable means ensuring that you consider each child's strengths, context, and needs and provide all children with the opportunities that will support them in reaching their potential.

It's crucial to recognize the inequities that children and their families face—in school and out. The position statement reminds us that "dominant social biases are rooted in the social, political, and economic structures of the United States. Powerful messages—conveyed through the media, symbols, attitudes, and actions—continue to reflect and promote both explicit and implicit bias." For example, research conducted by Yale University professor Walter Gilliam clearly shows that young African American boys are subject to higher rates of suspension and expulsion than their White European American peers.

How Cultural Diversity Shapes Behavior

Your culture and the children's cultures aren't the only cultures at work in your classroom. Every school and early childhood education program has a culture too. The cultures of most American schools are based on White European American values. As the makeup of the US population becomes more diverse, there is more cultural dissonance—which impacts children's behavior.

White European American culture has an individual orientation that teaches children to function independently, stand out, talk about themselves, and view property as personal. In contrast, many other cultures value interdependence, fitting in, helping others and being helped, being modest, and sharing property. In fact, some languages have no words for I, me, or mine.

Children who find themselves in an unfamiliar environment—such as a classroom that reflects a culture different from their home culture—are likely to feel confused, isolated, alienated, conflicted, and less competent because what they've learned so far in their home culture simply doesn't apply. They may not understand the rules, or they may be unable to communicate their needs in the school's language.

You can form authentic, caring relationships with children and families; build connections between what children already know and what they need to know; select activities, materials, and instructional strategies that honor children's cultures and life experiences; and teach children the skills they need to succeed in a global society

Availability

Alabama's new Special Needs Childcare Subsidy is available statewide.

Reimbursement

Participating centers will be reimbursed \$250 per week. There is no penalty when a child is not in attendance, so the center will be reimbursed regardless of attendance.

Inclusion Support

Childcare staff will have FREE access to training, consultation, technical assistance, and adaptive materials provided by Childcare Enhancement with a Purpose (CCEP) Inclusion Consultants statewide to support inclusion in the classroom.



About the Subsidy

Financial assistance is now available for qualifying Alabama families of a child with special needs to attend quality, inclusive childcare programs statewide. To qualify, the child must be receiving services (IFSP, IEP, private therapy, etc.).
